Requests for Translation and Interpreting Services

As an academic unit of the University of Illinois, the Center for Translation Studies supports and promotes recognized professional translation and interpreting standards. A core tenet of professional organizations for translators and interpreters, including the American Translators Association (ATA) and the International Association of Conference Interpreters (AIIC), is that anyone performing interpreting or translation services must be qualified and adequately compensated.

The Center for Translation Studies often receives requests for volunteer or paid translation and interpreting services. In the great majority of cases, all stakeholders are best served by consulting the directories of qualified translators and interpreters available here:
